Pregnant Mothers and Infants Program Referral Form

All services are voluntary.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC): provides benefits and supplemental healthy foods, nutrition education and counseling, health education and referrals, health service referrals for pregnant women and their children up to age five (5). Income requirements apply. All Medicaid clients qualify automatically.

Breastfeeding Education and Support: is for mothers who are or plan to breastfeed their baby. Breastfeeding Peer Counselors are mother's who have breastfed and understand the struggle, need for support and tips to help. If there is a breastfeeding concern that requires a professional, we have Certified Lactation Specialists and an IBCLC who can help mothers with success in their breastfeeding goals. This a free service.

Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP): In-home visits to **MEDICAID** mothers by nurses, a dietician, and a social worker to improve infant health through education and screenings. The program is available to pregnant or recently delivered mothers and infants. You can enroll in the MIHP during your first WIC appointment. Some WIC visits can be done in the home if you are enrolled.

Children's Special Health Care Services: Diagnostic assessment for medial specialty care, registered nurse case management, and financial support for children up to twenty-one (21) years of age with acute or chronic medical special health care needs. Participants qualify based on their medical diagnosis.

Healthy Families Northern Michigan: Iosco, Ogemaw and Oscoda Counties: At-home visits by trained nursing and child development experts to offer guidance, information and referrals to help parents prepare for a baby's birth and to raise a healthy family. Pregnant and new moms are eligible, and their baby must be enrolled by three (3) months of age. Once enrolled before the baby is three (3) months, services can continue through four (4) years of age. Visits are free regardless of income.

Syringe Services Program (SSP): Points of Hope aims to reduce risks, prevent communicable diseases like HIV, Hepatitis A, B and C and eliminate opioid-overdoses in individuals who use drugs. The program provides: sterile needles, syringes, and other supplies. Rapid, 20-minute, HIV testing, safe needle disposal containers, referral to substance use disorder programs (if desired), education and tools to prevent HIV, STD's and viral Hepatitis including counseling, condoms and vaccinations. Some personal items are available based on need. The services are **free, confidential and provided in a private area.**

Recovery Coach Services: Peer recovery support services through a certified Addiction and Recovery Coach. This service will provide a guide to initiate, achieve and sustain long-term recovery from addiction. Services are free, individualized and confidential.
